## **Gopher Plant**

Blue euphorbia, silver spurge, milkweed (not desert milkweed and not related to monarchs)

Euphorbia rigida

Family: Euphorbiaceae

**Plant Description:** A mounding perennial shrub. Leaf color is evergreen glaucous. Grows up to 2-feet by 3-feet wide. Its leaves are narrow and pointed, growing up to 1.5 inches long, and gray or blue-green colored.



**Bloom Description:** Blooms grow in rounded flower cluster in very late winter and spring. Chartreuse flowers change to green or tan and the stems die back after flowering.

*Cultural information/Uses/Human Interaction:* According to Pliny, Euphorbia is named for Euphorbus, physician of King Juba II of Numidia. One of the oldest documented medicinal plants. Ornamental, providing good winter color.

*Distribution/Range:* Native range is south Africa, eastern half of the Mediterranean, Europe, Turkey, Syria, the Caucasus, north of Iran, and Morocco.

Habitat: 0-2,500 feet is the preferred elevation. It grows in rocky slopes and scrub.

*Requirements:* Is hardy to 20 degrees. Prefers full sun to part shade. Requires water once per month, but more water in cooler temperatures will help invigorate it. Provide good drainage.

**Propagation:** Propagate through seeds or cuttings; prune old stems after flowers fade.

Pollinator: Insect pollinated.

Disease/Pathology: Poisonous. Sap can be an irritant.
